► 年度主题

本暑期班将根据中国社会的发展与变迁,以及中国研究领域的进展情况,每年选择不同的研讨主题,并根据研讨主题聘请4-6位中外教授(一般各为50%),组织田野考察。

2010年暑期班主题:

- 1、“中国经验”的世界意义
- 2、中国乡村:问题与发展
- 3、变化中的中国的城市性

► 日程安排

2010年中国研究暑期班将为期两周,具体时间为2010年7月5日-2010年7月18日,其中:

第一阶段(7月5日-7月11日):

将安排6-8场主题讲演;

地点:南京大学-霍普金斯大学“中美文化研究中心”

第二阶段(7月12日-7月16日):

将组织学生赴安徽皖南农村,江苏苏南等地城乡考察;

第三阶段(7月17日-18日):

将由参与者作汇报讲演,并进行学术总结;

► 学员来源

中国研究暑期班,将邀请全球范围内以中国为研究对象的社会与人文科学各领域的研究生或优秀高年级本科生40人,其中中国10人(含大陆、港、澳、台),美国10人,英国和欧洲国家10人,亚洲、澳洲等其他国家10人。申请人应具备如下条件:(1)在世界各国大学或研究机构攻读与中国相关的社会与人文科学学位,包括经济学、社会学、政治学(含国际政治和国际关系)、历史学、哲学、心理学、人类学、传播学、管理学等;(2)有来自本国的1名以上的从事社会科学研究的学者推荐;(3)提供2-3页的研究计划,在上述2010年的研究主题中,第一主题为研讨班全体学生的必修主题,第二和第三主题可以任选其一。

► 入选程序

1、2010年5月15日前,申请人通过电子邮件递交申请表、教授推荐信与研究计划;



2、2010年5月25日前,南京大学社会学院组织相关专家对申请人进行遴选,通过电子邮件发出录取通知(报到后将发给正式文本录取通知);

3、2010年6月10日前,入选者通过电子邮件递交个人护照或身份证等证件(PDF文件),由南京大学社会学院代为预订经济舱飞机票(国内学生短途为火车票),并通过电子邮件告知暑期班具体日程。

Summer School Invitation

➤ Aims

To spotlight the international implications of Chinese experiences against the background of globalization;

To provide young scholars of the world engaged in China studies an opportunity to understand China;

To share academic wisdom with outstanding researchers and be enlightened by criticisms from the younger generation;

To initiate world-wide exchange and cooperation among institutes for China Studies;

To advance international studies of China and promote their intellectual accumulation.

➤ Features

Interaction among professors, government officials and students to build a platform for communication, analysis and understanding of Chinese society;

Integration of indigenous perspectives and international horizons, which will be characterized by opinions about Chinese issues from both Chinese and international scholars;

Pluralism in class composition, which will come from the students' national, ethnic, regional and gender variety and result in gratifying communication between different cultures;

Classroom activities complemented by field research, which will facilitate theoretical understanding as well as empirical appreciation of both urban and rural China.

➤ Organizers

This summer school will be organized by the School of Social and Behavioral Sciences (SSBS), Nanjing University and other world-famous institutions and associations of China studies.

➤ Themes of the Year

Each year, different themes are chosen based on the evolution of Chinese society and development in China studies. Based on the chosen themes, four to six professors from both home and abroad will be appointed, and fieldwork will be organized.

Themes of 2010 Summer School

1. The international implications of Chinese experiences
2. Rural China: problems and developments
3. Changing urbanity in China

➤ Scheduling

The 2010 summer school will span three weeks from July 5 to July 18, 2010. It will have three phases.

Phase one (July 5- July 11): There will be six to ten theme lectures hosted by the Johns Hopkins University - Nanjing University Centre for Chinese and American Studies.

Phase two (July 12 - July 16): Students will visit cities and rural areas of southern Anhui Province and southern Jiangsu Province.

Phase three (July 17 - July 18): Closing presentations will be hosted by the Johns Hopkins University - Nanjing University Centre for Chinese and American Studies.

➤ Eligibility Criteria

The summer school is open to graduate students and outstanding undergraduates from all over the world. Each year there will be 40 enrollees, 10 of them from China (including Mainland China, Hong Kong, Macao and Taiwan), 10 from the USA, 10 from England and European Countries and 10 from other parts of the world.

The applicant should (1) be working at an institution of higher education or research on a degree of China-relevant social sciences and humanities such as economics, sociology, politics (including international politics and international relations), history, philosophy, psychology, anthropology, communication and management; (2) be recommended by at least one professor from the applicant's home country who specializes in China studies; and (3) submit a research plan, 2-3 pages in length. Among the above three themes of 2010, the first theme is required and the other two themes are elective.



➤ **Application procedure:**

1. By May 15, 2010, the application form, reference letter and research plan should be submitted via email.

2. By May 25, 2010, all applications will be forwarded to the SSBS for academic appraisal. Admission letters will first be delivered via email and then presented in printed copies on students' enrollment.

3. By June 10, 2010, those admitted should email (photocopies of) their passports or ID cards in a PDF file. The SSBS will then book air tickets (or train tickets for short-distance travelers from Mainland China). The summer school schedule will be sent via email.

➤ **Further information**

1. Nature of award

This summer school is financed by the above-mentioned organizers and sponsor. The award for each enrollee consists of:

(1) round trip airfare (economy class) or train/coach ticket (hard seat/berth) for short-distance travel;

(2) travel expenses (by train/coach) from the airport of arrival in China to Nanjing University in Gulou district;

(3) accommodations and meals from July 4 – July 19, 2010; and

(4) costs for out-of-town visits, including travel expenses.
